Setting Up Your Equipment

- A delivery technician will set up your trapeze.The technician will attach the trapeze to the bed end.
- The technician will adjust the grab bar to the appropriate level for you.

Using Your Equipment

- The technician who installs your equipment will explain and demonstrate how to adjust the grab bar and the height of the trapeze.
- The trapeze is used in conjunction with the bed to provide support, increase stability, and assist you when repositioning yourself in bed.
- The trapeze is **not** designed to support the total body weight of an individual. The trapeze can assist an individual weighing up to 250 pounds
